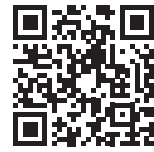


MATERIALS

Scheepjes Peru

(20% Alpaca, 80% Acrylic; 100g/75m)

- 4 x 100g balls of Scheepjes Peru, in your chosen colour
- 12mm circular knitting needles, 80cm long
- Stitch marker

INSPIRATION IN EVERY BALL OF YARN

Gauge/Tension

7 sts and 10 rows to measure
10 x 10cm over garter st using
12mm needles and holding
yarn double stranded

Measurements

Circumference 80cm (31½in)
Height 38cm (15in)

Abbreviations

RS right side
st(s) stitch(es)
[] number of sts on a given round

Pattern Notes

Cowl is worked double-stranded, with two strands of yarn held together and used as one (use two balls at the same time, taking one strand from each). It is worked in the round and in garter st: purl one round, knit one round. Use stitch marker to indicate beginning/end of each round.

(Note: garter st in the round as used here alternates purl and knit rounds. Garter st on straight needles means every row is a knit row.)

Instructions

Cast on 52 sts. Being careful not to twist sts, join to work in round.

Round 1 (RS) Purl. [52 sts]

Round 2 (RS) Knit. [52 sts]

Repeat Rounds 1-2 until Cowl measures 38cm.

Cast off loosely.

To Finish

Weave in ends.

How to join a round

Check the correct number of stitches have been cast on, and that the cast on row is not twisted. Place a stitch marker on the point of the right needle, and when knitting or purling the first stitch, pull tight to prevent a hole forming.

Tip For a neat result, cast on one extra stitch. Slip first cast on stitch onto right needle, place stitch marker, knit or purl the round to last two stitches before marker, knit or purl last two stitches together.
